On August 1, 1876, president Ulysses S. Grant signed a proclamation admitting Colorado as a state. Colorado Day was celebrated as a state holiday on August 1 for many years, and then was moved to the first Monday in August, most likely after the time the U.S. Congress passed the Uniform Holidays Bill in 1968. The day no longer became a public holiday, but rather an observance, when the state started observing [Martin Luther King Jr. Day](#) as a public holiday in 1985.

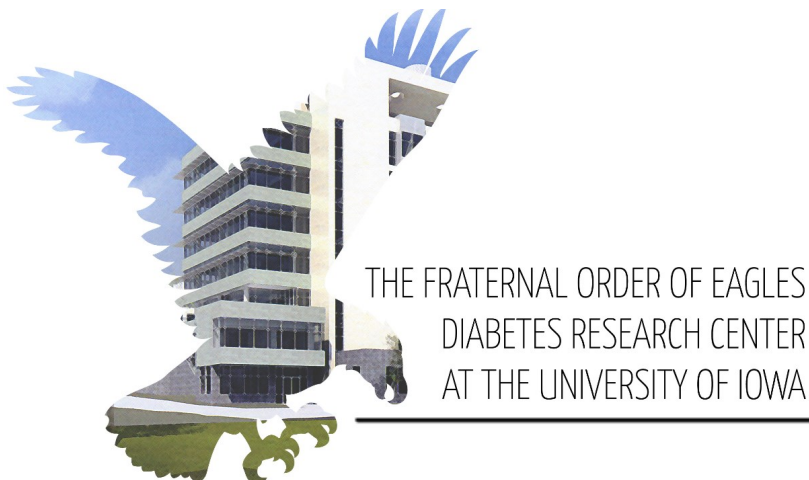

Check the bulletin board for updates and further guidelines. Remove all trash, no collection is provided for you. Clean the area campsite where you park, no exceptions. BBQ grills or fire pits must be maintained and guarded at all times or extinguished. Maximum speed in the park is 5 MPH, signs are posted. Camping sites are on a first come basis, no reservations! Tenting area is for tents only. Toilets are provided for your convenience, please be considerate of others, keep them clean. **Dogs will be on a leash at all times, no exceptions!!** No animals allowed in the building. No smoking in the building, this includes Electronic Vapor Cigarettes

Entertainment

Horse Shoe Tournament will be on a 50/50 basis. 50% goes to the state park and 50% will be divided among the contestants. There is a charge to enter the contest and a chairman will have the rules. Entertainment, bingo, pickles, poker, games of chance and pull tabs will be handled by the Past Aerie President's Club

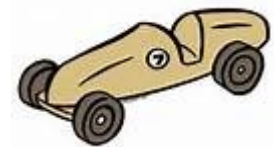

Pinewood Derby Rules



ALL CARS MUST PASS INSPECTION TO QUALIFY FOR THE RACE

Following are the inspection points

1. The car weight shall not exceed 5.0 ounces. The official race scale shall be considered final.
2. The overall length of the car shall not exceed 7 inches.
3. The overall width of the car shall not exceed 2 ¾ inches.
4. The car must have 1 ¾" clearance between the wheels.
5. The car must have 3/8" clearance underneath the body.
6. The wood provided in a kit must be used. The block may be shaped any way that is desired.
7. The wheels supplied with the kit must be used. The wheels may not be cut, drilled, beveled or rounded. You may remove the seam from the wheels.
8. The axles supplied with the kit must be used. They may be polished or lubricated.
9. Wheel bearings, washers or bushings are prohibited.
10. The car must not ride on any type of springs.
11. The car must be freewheeling, with no starting devices.
12. No loose material of any kind, such as lead shot, may be used.
13. Only one car may be registered by any person in the Pinewood Derby.
14. Only dry lubricants such as graphite or powdered teflon "white lube" will be allowed for lubricating the wheels. Lubricants may not foul the track.
15. Only one lubrication is allowed before the beginning of each race

Each car must pass inspection by the official inspection/weigh in committee before it will be allowed to compete. The Committee has the responsibility to disqualify those cars that do not meet these specifications.
